Creation and restoration/enhancement of 250 ha of wetland, heathlands, meadows, hedgerows, woodlands



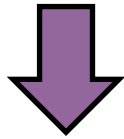
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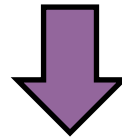

All native herpetofauna in the forest

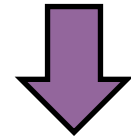
