








NFBF Strategic Research Programme

Four proposals received and assessed in the 2024 call, with two taken forward for funding:

Assessing the impact of dog veterinary flea treatments on aquatic invertebrates in New Forest ponds

£38k allocated - to be delivered by Freshwater Habitats Trust in summer 2025

New Forest heathland plants and the role of fire in their germination

£33.5k allocated - match-funding for University of Exeter MRes student (Green Smith)

2025 funding call will open in late March 2025



Nearly 40 rare species have been recorded in the New Forest during a project to restore areas for nature.





New Forest Biodiversity Audit

- Area to be covered = New Forest National Park
- ➤ Animals, plants, fungi, and lichens/bryophytes in scope (>20,000 species)
- > Footprint Ecology are being commissioned to co-ordinate the project
- Important roles for HBIC and local expert ecologists
- Oversight from NFBF Steering Group
- > Output will include species list with identification of priority / flagship species
- > Output will also include ecological requirements of species assemblages
- ➤ Audit due to commence in summer 2025 with delivery within one year
- Current plan is to provide an annual update to the audit from 2026 onwards

New Forest Volunteer Ecological Surveyor Programme (VESPA)



- Due to be launched in early April 2025, with an initial focus on the Crown Lands
- VESPA will provide training, guidance, and insurance cover for registered volunteers
- Strategic priorities and Forestry England bioblitz on 26 May 2025 provide initial focus






